Group A-Elite Doctoral Student Award Competition 2023

A. The guideline is based on the regulation of Elite Doctoral Student Award.

- Eligibility: All currently enrolled CMU 1st to 5th year doctoral students.
- Contestants must be nominated by their advisors. Recommendation letter from their advisor and statement of research accomplishment should be submitted for **Initial Selection** held by each college.
- The contestants who are selected and recommended by each college after the **Initial Selection** (i.e. Semi-finalists) are qualified to participate in the secondary **Poster Presentation Contest**. The Semi-finalists are expected to present their poster at the indicated time. The committee members of Elite Doctoral Student Award will be judges for the Group A competition. The finalist will be selected according to the score ranking and advanced to the final oral contest.
- For the **Final Oral Contest**, finalists shall prepare <u>slides</u> and <u>abstract</u> (PDF format) in English and submit to the Office of Graduate Student Affairs in advance. The <u>Oral Contest</u> consists of 10 minutes of oral presentation about their research plus Q&A for 3 minutes.

B. Important dates:

- The announcement of the **Initial Selection**: Apr 14th, 2023
- ≥ Poster submission deadline: Apr 27th ,2023
- The date of **Poster Presentation Contest**: will be separately notified.
- ➤ Abstract and Slide submission deadline: May 03rd, 2023
- The date of **Final Oral Contest**: will be separately notified.

C. The venue and the exact dates for Poster Presentation Contest and Oral Presentation will be announced via email.

D. Prizes for Final Oral Contest*

■ The First place: NTD\$ 50,000

■ The Second place: NTD\$ 30,000

■ The Third place: NTD\$ 10,000

E. Notices

- The same poster could not be submitted for both Group A and Group B contest. If doctoral contestants do not pass the **Initial Selection** in Group A, they could use the same poster to enter the Group B contest. The contestants should complete the online registration before the deadline.
- The poster will be printed out by the Office of Graduate Student Affairs with no additional costs.
- The contestants are expected to present their poster at the indicated time. The contestants must attend the contest. Otherwise your absence might affect your score in the contest.
- Semi-finalists are required to attend the entire oral contest.
- The poster may contain the information that has been presented at other meetings or conferences. The poster cannot contain the same content previously used in this contest.
- The contestant must follow research ethics and copyright regulations should be followed. Direct translation or plagiarism of the research paper is not permitted. All citations must be properly referenced.

Poster Guideline (Submission deadline: Apr. 27th, 2023)

- Posters must be A0 Size (840mm*1200mm) with portrait layout.
- Posters should include title, author's names and affiliations.
- Posters should include the following sections: Introduction, materials and methods, results and conclusions.
- The poster should be submitted in PDF format. The filename should be "Student ID-Department-Name". Please upload the file in https://reurl.cc/klqLqq.

Abstract Guideline (For Group A) (Submission deadline: May. 03rd, 2023)

- English Abstract less than 500 words is required.
- Please include your student ID and name at the top in the first line. The text should be align right with 10 points in the first line at the top
- The format should be PDF file. Please upload the file in https://forms.gle/VtXZ52jvYj8bX7ry8.
 - Font type should be Times New Roman.
 - Text
 - 1. Research Topic: 14 points, bold face, align center
 - 2. Author information: 12 points, bold face, align center
 - 3. Key words: 12 points, align left, 3 to 5 words
 - **♦** Author information should include author's name, department, and phone number.
 - The abstract should be in A4 Size
 - Page margin should be 2.5 cm in top, bottom, left, and right.



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1. On the **Design** tab of the Ribbon, locate **Slide Size** in the **Customize** group, near the far right end of the toolbar.



2. Select Slide Size, and then select Custom Slide Size.



The Slide Size dialog box opens.


- 3. In the Slide Size dialog box, ensure the orientation is set the way you want it.
- 4. In the **Height** and **Width** boxes, PowerPoint accepts measurements in *inches*, *centimeters*, or *pixels*. Type a number followed by a space and then the appropriate abbreviation: in, cm, or px.

PowerPoint then converts measurements, if necessary, to the type of unit your operating system uses.

5. Click OK.

When PowerPoint is unable to automatically scale your content, it prompts you with two options:

- Maximize: Select this option to increase the size of your slide content when you are scaling to a larger slide size. Choosing this option could result in your content not fitting on the slide.
- Ensure Fit: Select this option to decrease the size of your content when scaling to a smaller slide size. This could
 make your content appear smaller, but you'll be able to see all content on your slide.



You can change the unit of measure that is shown in PowerPoint dialog boxes if you like.
